I don't run much in rain here in Arizona, but I did a run on March at Cal Speedway. We had rain all day and temps in upper 40's. As we were on grid the skies opened with hail and a driving rain. Conditions

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were so bad that you had to drive around the puddles in places and a number of guys parked it on warm up lap. I ran with 1 wiper, rain X, and shaving cream on the inside glass. I just put some on wipe it down. I also have my stock heat box with the vents fixed to "defrost" mode. No working heater or blower motor so just speed based cold air.

My visibility was a good as can be expected with zero fogging. The only bad part was when a low afternoon sun popped up and in one place you simply could not see foward due to spray. I had to look out the side windows to see where the flag stand to know where the corner was. Still that was unique to the conditions.
